## Cultural and Educational Exchange Programme



A Cultural and educational exchange programme was organised by the Delhi Government in the month of September 2019. Our school participated in the same, with Government Co-ed school, F-Block, Vikaspuri.

Our school visited the Government school on 3<sup>rd</sup> Sep 2019, as the Guest school. We took 30 students along with 2 teachers (Ms. Ashpinder & Ms. Leena).
