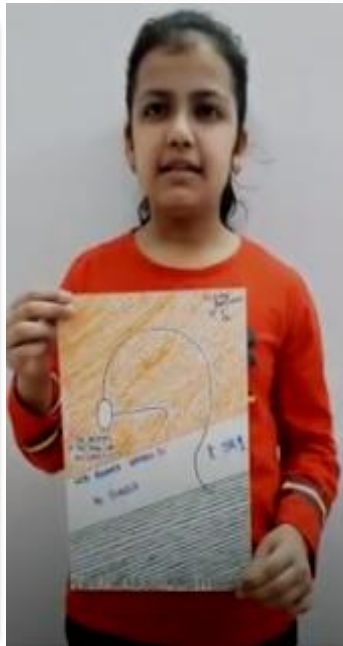
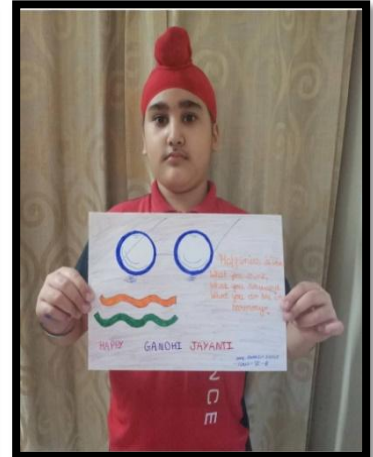
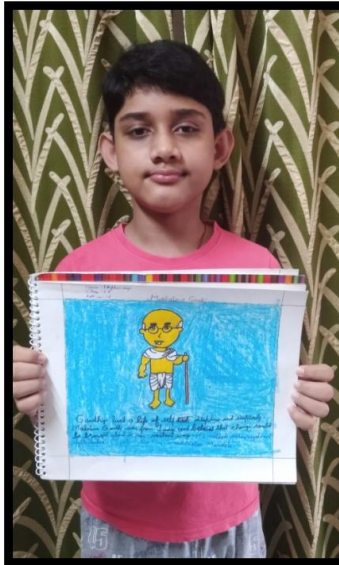
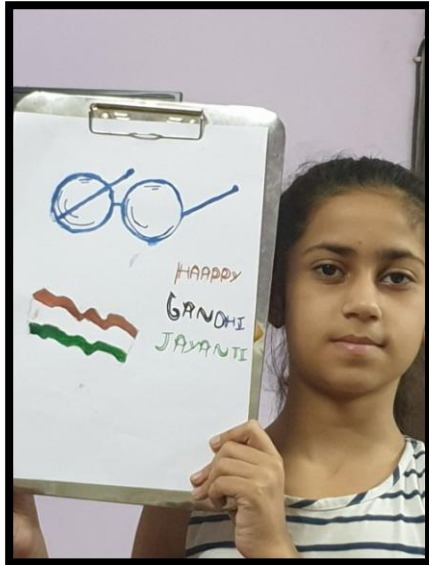


St. Cecilia's Public School Gandhi Jayanti celebrations Middle Wing
